


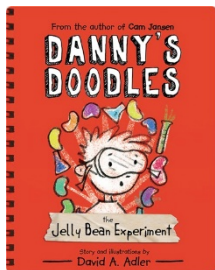
Welcome to our first Digital Book Club!

5. Choose the top books you want to read by [clicking here to fill out the online form](#).

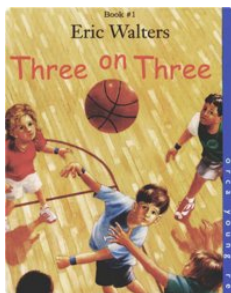

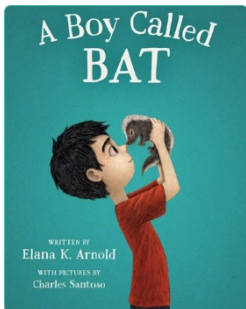

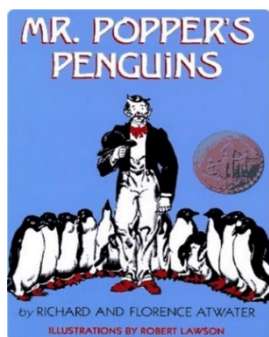
