! A =  $\frac{\text{masc}}{\text{un}}$  /  $\frac{\text{fem}}{\text{une}}$

The =  $\frac{\text{masc}}{\text{le}}$  /  $\frac{\text{fem}}{\text{la}}$

If you want to translate the word **banana**, you need to search up either...

- A potato or...  
→ **une** pomme de terre
- The potato  
→ **la** pomme de terre
- The potatoes  
→ **les** pommes de terres
