<p>I can share my learning with the class with:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Confidence • “Realness” • Clarity • Expression • Appropriate volume • Eye contact • Attentive listening 	<p>I get silly when I am talking in front of the class; and/or my nerves might have gotten the better of me</p> <p>I can attempt to speak in my own natural voice, but I often slip into “presenter” voice</p> <p>It was a little hard to follow what I was saying</p> <p>It sounds a little like I am reading a list or words</p> <p>You might have to sit in the front row to hear me</p> <p>I like to look at my notes while I am speaking</p> <p>I need to be reminded not to talk or play with things in my desk while others are sharing, or my attention wanders a lot</p>	<p>I can stand in front of the class and share my learning</p> <p>I can speak in my own, natural voice most of the time; I sometimes sound like I am giving a formal presentation</p> <p>My ideas are mostly easy to follow, but I sometimes get lost or lose clarity</p> <p>I can speak with some expression</p> <p>I can speak clearly, but you might have to lean in a little to hear</p> <p>I can make fairly regular eye contact with the audience during my presentation</p> <p>I can listen to other groups share their learning</p>	<p>I can speak with confidence and pride about my learning</p> <p>I can speak in my own, natural and relaxed voice; I sound like a person speaking to other people</p> <p>I can share my ideas in a way that helps the audience understand my content</p> <p>I can speak with expression and capture people’s interest</p> <p>I can speak so that the back row and the sides of the room can hear me</p> <p>I can consistently, democratically, and naturally make genuine eye contact with people in the audience</p> <p>I can listen attentively to other groups share their learning</p>
