COMPROMLSE

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Lauren wants to go to the beach for the family day trip, but her brother wants to go to the zoo. Her parents said they have to agree on where to go. How can they compromise?

Frank likes to listen to audio books in the car on the way to school, but his sister likes to listen to Radio Disney. How can they compromise?
