## **CONTEST RULES:**

- Art can be a combination of slogans, phrases, images
- Any medium (grade 8-12 students may submit original digital designs)
- Submit .jpeg or .png images of original work
- Keep students' original art until May 31, 2023
- Winners will be contacted & announced in late May/early June

#### **JUDGING CRITERIA:**

- Effective communication of a climate justice message to BC students
- Message (pictorial and/or text) is clear, specific, eye-catching, inspiring
- ➤ **Primary/intermediate topics may include** hyper-consumerism, needs vs/wants, sustainable transportation, how to be an environmental steward, Indigenous perspectives, etc.
- > Secondary topics (more complex) may include: carbon emissions, environmental racism, environmental privilege, global north/south, climate activism, political engagement, system change, Indigenous climate actions, etc.

#### **PRIZES:**

- Primary, intermediate, & secondary winners will have their work printed by the BCTF into large colour posters, for display in over 1500 public schools in BC
