<b>Structure and Content</b>		Student follows the proper structure and requirements of a news story (Who, What, When, where, why, and how)	Student attempts to follow the proper structure and requirements of a news story (Who, What, When, where, why, and how)	Student need to review the proper structure and requirements of a news story (Who, What, When, where, why, and how)
