

# February I, 2023

- FRENCH
  - Students completed a "Scoot" activity to review the present tense conjugations of the verb *aller*
- SEL
  - o Students began working on a "Classroom Climate Questionnaire"
- SCIENCE
  - Students did a review of pure substances and mixtures through hearing riddles read aloud an identifying the thing being described and then classifying in as a pure substance, heterogenous mixture, or homogenous mixture

February 5, 2023

- BUDDIES
- ELA
  - Students reviewed the story "Frog" and completed a story arc for it identifying the exposition, conflict, rising action, climax, falling action, and resolution

- Students took up story arcs as a class
- Students discussed the idea of plotlines and looked at some common plotlines in narratives. Students discussed in small groups what they would expect to see in a story with the given plot lines, and copied definitions from the board
- Students were given spinner templates onto which they copied the common plotlines and decorated it (to be used in a later class)

  - Students used on online calculator to get a better sense of what their net monthly pay would be with more realistic deductions
  - Students established how much money they could spend on housing for next class

#### February 6, 2023

- SEL
  - Students continued working on Classroom Climate Questionnaire
- SOCIAL STUDIES
  - Students completed a quiz game about the different places seen in the geography of the world map worksheet
  - Students reviewed their maps
  - Students had time to work on their early hominid projects
- SCIENCE

## February 7, 2023

- SEL
  - Students engaged in a discussion about Active Listening
  - Students read a text about active listening and its connection to empathy
- ELA

# February 8, 2023

- ELA
  - Students built their understanding of "Point of View" in the conext of a narrative and worked to complete a graph with the features of the different types of point of view (first person, second person, third person limited, and third person omniscient)
  - Students engaged in a discussion about Point of View in Narratives
