Program Overview



Bienvenue à French 11! This course contains a variety of activities to help students develop their skills in all language areas: listening, speaking, reading and writing. At times, we will be going at a relatively quick pace, so be prepared to use your time well, ask questions when you don't understand, work hard and have some fun while we're at it! One of the areas in which students are often most hesitant is with speaking in French. I cannot encourage you enough to be brave and always try! Unless we take risks and practice, it's pretty hard to get better! As humans, we all make mistakes, but that's ok because it provides opportunities to grow and develop our skills.

Some of the grammar concepts we will learn include the passé composé & imparfait, reflexive verbs, the conditionnel, object pronouns and relative pronouns. We will explore topics including the home and activities around the house (like chores), food, grocery shopping, restaurants, getting around town and phrases that will be helpful if you are a tourist in a francophone region.

We will be using the D'Accord 2 textbook and workbook as well as the online component (Supersite).

Here are some tips to help you be successful this year in French class:

1. Ask questions! I am so happy to answer your questions and help you out. We have **flex time** each Wednesday & Thursday (10:37am -11:49am) for you to come and get extra help if you need it (and I'm often available after school too). If ever you feel that you don't quite understand, please come ask for help!!
2. Be respectful! This seems so obvious, but it's easy to forget how valuable this is in creating and maintaining positive relationships with others!
3. Come to class on time!
4. Practice, practice, practice!
 - Complete and hand in your work on time
 - Assignments are always due at the **beginning** of class, and you must bring any typed assignments already printed (you will not be able to go to the library to print it once class has started). Assignments that are not handed in at the beginning of class will not be accepted; instead the assignment will be excused.
 - Electronic assignments are always to be submitted through TEAMS.
 - Speak in French as much as you can! (Yes, I'm saying it again!)
