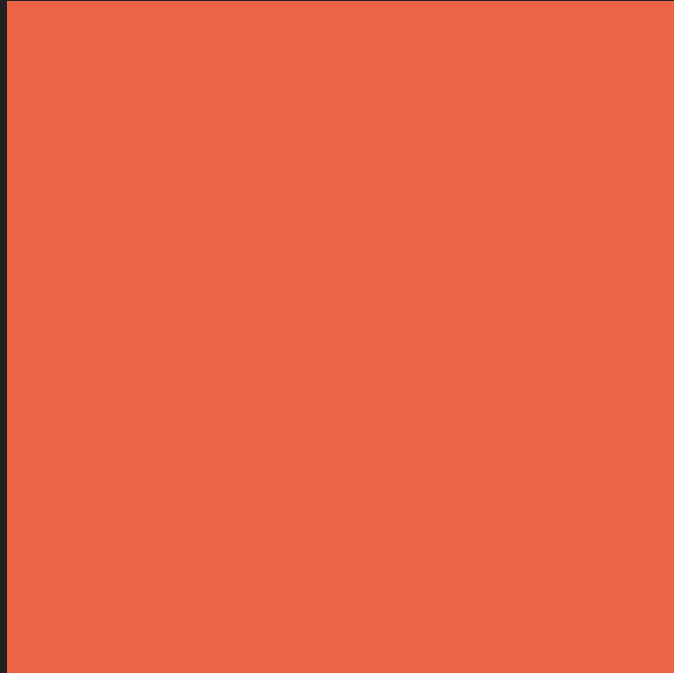


What is a law? What are some examples of laws?

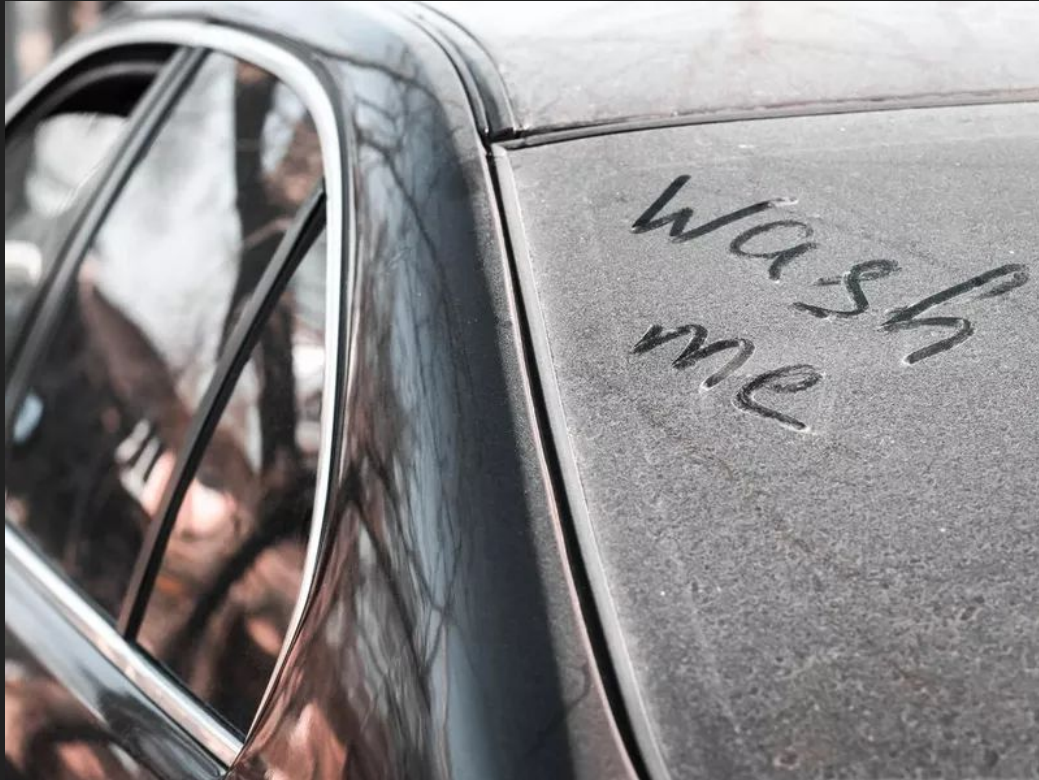
