Dear Parents/Guardians,


We are currently learning about continents and other map skills in class. Among them, we are learning how to locate our city, province, country, and continent on maps and globes. Now we would like your help!

When the travelers return to our school, we will plot Stanley's whereabouts on our map and share the information received with each other. It will be a tremendous learning experience for your child. We are all very excited about it!! If your family is travelling during this school year your child will be creating another Flat Stanley they can bring along on your adventures!
